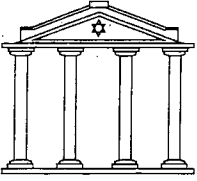

We hope that you and your loved ones are healthy and safe. We are writing to share the plan that Temple leadership has developed for Purim and Passover this year.


DATE/TIME	EVENT	DETAILS
Saturday, March 12, 10:30 a.m.	<u>LIVE EVENT – Purim Tot Shabbat:</u> Families are invited for a special Purim-themed Tot Shabbat program with Rabbi Kessler in the Lehrman Chapel.	Masks and physical distancing are required, regardless of vaccination status.
Wednesday, March 16, starting at 12:00 p.m. and available at your convenience for the duration of Purim.	<u>PRE-RECORDED Purim Spiel:</u> Enjoy the replay of the temple's most recent Purim Spiel, "All Shook Up: The Elvis Megillah" (2020). Approximately 1 hour. Rated PG-13.	The link to the video will be posted on the "Upcoming Events" page of the Temple's website, at www.ohvsholom.org . Friday, March 18, starting at 6:00 p.m.	<u>LIVE EVENT – Shabbat Service/Purim Program:</u> Rabbi Kessler will lead our regular Friday night Shabbat services, immediately followed by a discussion about Queen Esther during "Soup and Study" (minus the Soup). Both events will be in the sanctuary and also broadcast on our live-stream. For those participating in person, masks and physical distancing are required, regardless of vaccination status.
Friday, April 15, 5:00 p.m.	<u>LIVE EVENT – Shabbat Service:</u> Rabbi Kessler will lead our regular Friday night Shabbat services. It will be in the sanctuary and also broadcast on our live-stream. Note that the service will begin <u>earlier than usual</u> , because it will be followed by the congregational seder described below.	The link to the service will be posted on the "Upcoming Events" page of the Temple's website, at www.ohvsholom.org . See the big green button on the top left of the home page. For those participating in person, masks and physical distancing are required, regardless of vaccination status.

<p>Friday, April 15, 6:00 p.m.</p> <p><i>This 30-minute live event will start <u>on time</u>, so please log on to the Zoom a few minutes early.</i></p>	<p><u>LIVE EVENT – Passover Seder:</u> Via Zoom, Rabbi Kessler will lead our traditional annual seder, using the same <i>30-Minute Haggadah</i> that we always use. Participate and follow along with or without your own seder plate. After we complete the reading of the haggadah, the event will end so that members can proceed to their own meals. Like last year, there is no charge for this event.</p> <p>Although the seder will take place live via Zoom, <u>we will also post a recording of the event immediately afterwards</u> in case you can't attend and/or wish to use the recording on the second or other nights of Passover.</p>	<p>The links to the live Zoom event, the recording, and the haggadah will be posted on the "Upcoming Events" page of the Temple's website, at www.ohvsholom.org. See the big green button on the top left of the home page.</p> <p>You will be prompted to enter a case-sensitive password to access the haggadah.
