MESSAGE FROM RABBI MARC

Summer is in full swing! Even those of us who have year-round work, somehow find time to take time away for the summer. Too often, though, we see “fun time” as “down time.” We may be on vacation, but nowhere in the “I’m On Vacation Manual” did I find the words, “So, I can’t do something meaningful to help save the planet.”

Jewishly, we have a twisted way of looking at this subject. Since everyday is a gift, everyday is one in which we get to choose how we spend it. While so many people are shackled to their jobs, the goal is to live as my Grandpa Raymond saw life, “If you love what you do, it’s not work.”

Even religious observance is always supposed to be a matter of choice. One does not say, “I have to do something,” or, “I am not allowed to do something.” For everything we do, we choose to observe or not to.

That said, during our “every day lives,” we make sure to spend time doing good work for the world around us. Similarly, on the days that we choose not to work, we still face the same responsibility to make responsible choices. That said, here are a few “summer” activities that will be fun, bonding, and healing:

1. Of course, wherever you recreate – clean up! Bring a couple of extra bags with you to leave a place nicer than you found it.
2. Invite guests to join you in your year-round outdoor sukkah where the cloud-cover acts as your skakh (see through roof).
3. Get into wildlife photography. On Facebook, look up Ginger Clayton. While she was a high school girlfriend, she does amazing work with animal photography. Her work has inspired many to pick it up!
4. Build and plant an herb garden! Everything you cook will have tastier and fresher flavors.
5. Read outdoors! With natural light, resting in the elements (shade and sunscreen are important), books just read better.

Treat the time you choose not to work, still as time to grow. I recommend a book to every family (if you can still get your hands on it). Joel Grishaver was perhaps the greatest and most influential Jewish educator of the 20th century. Of the many great texts that he authored, “40 things You Can DO To Save The Jewish People” stands out as the best. While, yes, a few chapters are outdated (he knows but is no longer able to focus on a rewrite), he makes us expand our vision. He devotes one chapter to observing Shabbat while in Disneyland. None of the lessons are “Jewish for the sake of Jewish.” In each case, he calls on readers to pay closer attention to the work of healing the world – by always paying attention.

Stay in touch with us. We are here all summer. Please choose to keep showing up here, too!

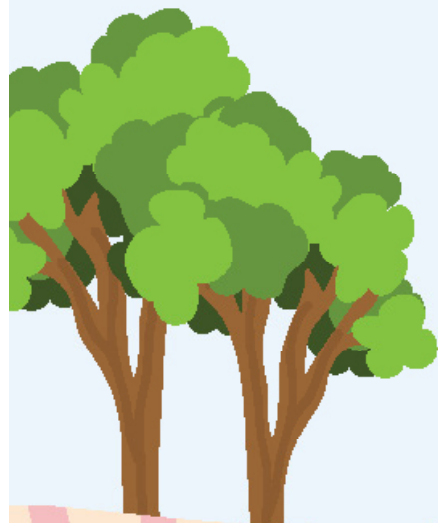

TEMPLE OHEV SHOLOM FUNDS

Did you know that, like Sisterhood, Temple Ohev Sholom also has a variety of funds that can be contributed to for any occasion? - **Temple Fund** - Money in this fund is used to supplement the Temple expenses for projects, budgetary items, and other needs.

Religious School - Summer is out, Planning is in!

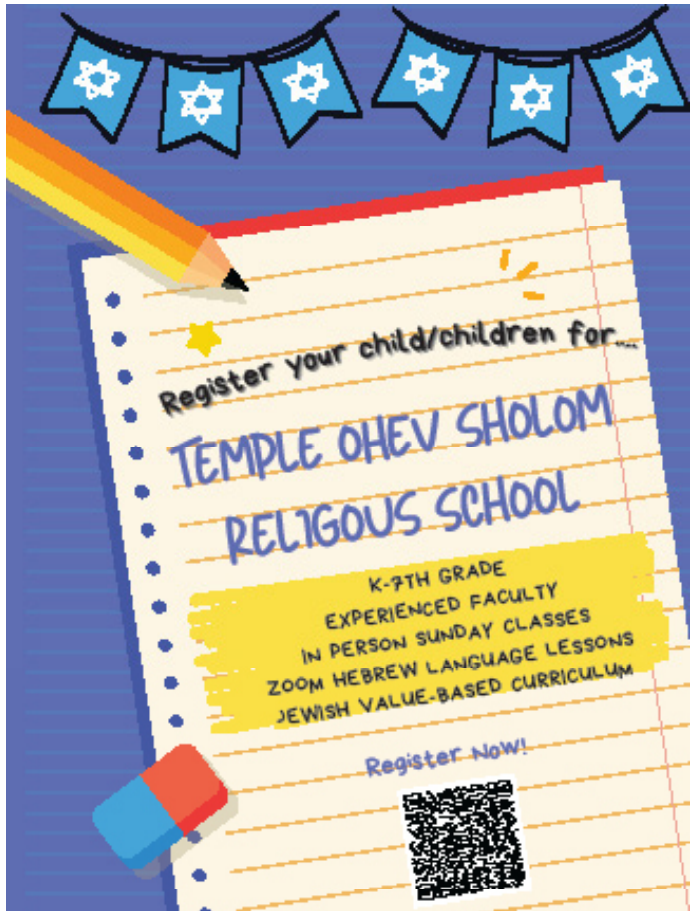

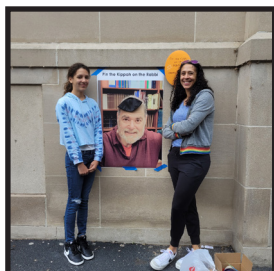

- Performing other duties as assigned

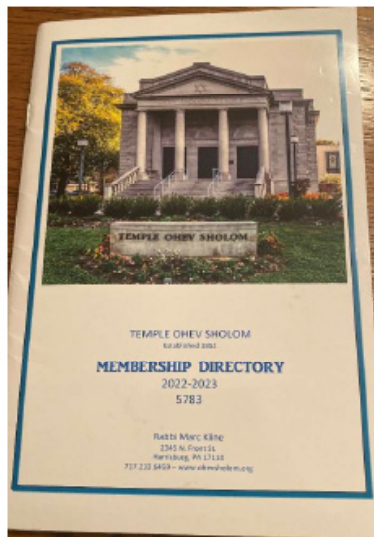
