MESSAGE FROM RABBI MARC

Where did the summer go? All the plans families made, the excitement in the preparation, the joy in the execution, and the memories that will continue to nourish over the many years: welcome back to “normal living.” Ok, for many of us, the summer did not go as planned. Many experienced painful distractions, celebrated surprises, and the chaos of keeping up with an ever-changing world. For still others, the summer passed and every day looked no different than the day before.

For all of us, whichever category describes our lives, we stand on the cusp of renewal. Our Jewish calendar year is winding down only so that it can turn a new page and we can start over – again.

The High Holy Days provide us a concrete push to do the work we need to do every day, but don't. From the Talmud:

Rabbi Eliezer's students asked him, “When should a person do his atonement and reconciliation?” The sage answered, “On the day before you die.” They looked at him quizzically, “How can we know when that will be?” He answered, we don't, so we should be fixing relationships and celebrating each other every day.”

Fixing relationships with ourselves and each other takes concentration and practice. The work requires us to engage with each other, letting people know how you have impacted their lives and how you hope to have positively impacted yours. If you admire someone, let them know. If you have concerns about interactions with people, let them know of your concern and your hope to reconcile any leftover baggage. This coming month provides us an opportunity to create a habit of what I call, “creating a surplus budget of kindness” for the coming year. The effort pays enormous dividends.

RELIGIOUS SCHOOL UPDATES

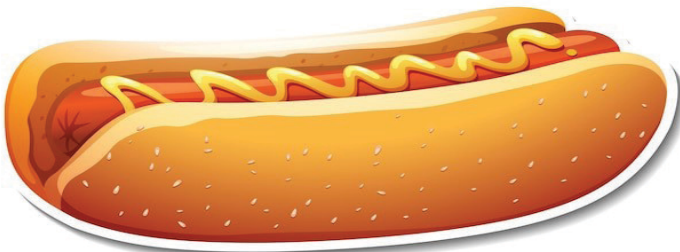
