Board Member Spotlight

Steve Davidheiser

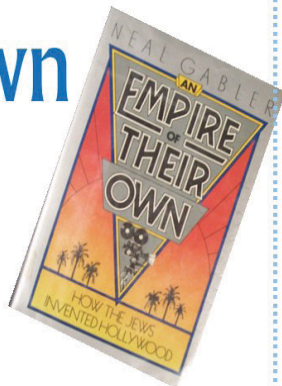
