So join us in showing our gratitude, either thru your financial support or your time. And help make this new year sweeter for our Temple Ohev Sholom family. La'Shanah Tova!



## **Board Member Spotlight**

#### Steve Davidheiser

#### **Temple Ohev Sholom Funds**




- Alex White Library Fund contributions are used to purchase children's books in the Temple Library.




