# MESSAGE FROM THE PRESIDENT

Planning for the future can feel overwhelming. It's exciting to imagine the possibilities, yet stressful when we consider potential challenges. When that planning involves an entire community—especially the Reform Jewish community in Greater Harrisburg—we'll let's just say it can give you a lot of tsuris!

The Board has been working to create an organizational and committee structure that reflects the core values, mission, and vision that you helped define during our *Build, Bond, and Bagel* series. This process has been thoughtful and deliberate, aimed at ensuring that our structure supports growth and opportunity while also defining roles, responsibilities, accountability, and the resources needed to succeed.

The result of this process will be additional Constitution and Bylaws changes that will be presented to the congregation at our annual meeting in June, as well as a budget that ensures there are resources to build our future.

You play an important role in this process and we will be asking for your feedback as these efforts proceed.

Right now, the most important way you can help shape the future of Temple Ohev Sholom is by participating in the visit of our Settled Rabbinical Candidate, Rabbi Tzvia Jasper. She will be with us from **January 11-13** for a series of meet and greets, and we encourage you to attend. Then, on **January 16**, we will hold a congregational meeting to vote on whether to extend an offer to Rabbi Jasper. As outlined in our updated Constitution and Bylaws, the process for selecting a settled rabbi involves meeting with the candidate and then voting to move forward. For the vote to pass, two-thirds of the members present at the meeting must approve the decision.

This is *the* critical moment in defining the future of Temple Ohev Sholom. Your Search Committee has dedicated significant time and effort to this process, and they believe that Rabbi Jasper is the right candidate to help guide us into the future. Please take the opportunity to meet her, ask questions, and share in this exciting moment for our community.

As always, I'm here if you have any questions or would like to discuss these matters further.

# RABBINICAL CANDIDATE MEET & GREET

We are excited to announce that after an extensive search and many thoughtful conversations, the Rabbinic Search Committee has invited Rabbi Tzvia Jasper to visit Temple Ohev Sholom as part of the process of selecting our next settled Rabbi. Rabbi Jasper, currently the Assistant Rabbi and Director of Engagement, Education, and Outreach at Temple Israel in Tulsa, Oklahoma, will be visiting us from January 11-13.

In her personal statement, Rabbi Jasper shares:

*“I truly love what I do. For me, the Rabbinic is a calling. I could not imagine doing anything more impactful with my life. My passion for Judaism is interwoven into everything I do, with the hope of creating a safe and authentic space for others to discover their love of Judaism as well. My dedication to creativity means I bring my enthusiasm for ongoing learning to every Adult Education course, Religious School class, and casual conversation I participate in. My job as a Rabbi is to be the ease of my community and support them through each brushstroke of life.”*

This is an important and exciting moment for our community, and we encourage everyone to participate, share your thoughts, and be a part of shaping the future of Temple Ohev Sholom. Please join us for the events on January 11-13, and don't miss the vote on January 16!

# FACILITIES COMMITTEE REPORT

As the year comes to a close, I wanted to take a moment to reflect on and celebrate the significant successes we've achieved together in improving our building and its surroundings. We've made substantial progress, and I'm incredibly proud to call Ohev my spiritual home.

I want to extend my sincere gratitude to everyone involved in these projects, from planning and coordination to execution and completion. Your hard work and dedication are truly appreciated.

Thanks to our collective efforts, we've successfully tackled several key projects, but we need to plan:

- **Roof Repairs:** There were leaks in the sanctuary, the chapel, and the school. We now have a handle on them. Unfortunately, the main roof over the school is reaching the end of its expected life and will need to be replaced. The anticipated cost of roof replacement over the chapel and classroom building is on the order of \$100,000. A fundraising campaign will likely be needed to fund this critical project to sustain our home.
- **Landscaping Enhancements:** We have a plan for the landscaping. To create a more inviting space, many of the plants needed to be removed. This created an open space and highlighted the beauty of the sanctuary and its stained-glass windows. The plan is to continue to trim back or remove bushes in the spring and to begin with plants that will provide color and vibrance throughout the year. A new paver patio to house the sukkah off of parking lot is also being considered.
- **Exterior Building Cleaning:** The thorough cleaning of the exterior building and paved areas has made a noticeable difference. We now have a clean, bright, and inviting sanctuary.
- **Sanctuary Coatroom Repairs:** This area was continually wet and deteriorated. The ceiling needed to be removed to provide safe conditions and to investigate the source of the leakage. The suspected cause of the water was infiltration through the ceiling from leaks in the roof and masonry joints. We hired a contractor to seal the joints and apply a sealer to the roof area over the coatroom.
- **Plumbing Repair:** We continue to repair 100+ year old copper pipes as leaks are discovered. This effort will continue on an as-needed basis and is part of maintaining our historic home.

- **Security Grants:** We have been awarded additional grant dollars to continue to improve our current security posture.

These accomplishments are a testament to our teamwork, and commitment to maintaining our spiritual home. Each of these projects presented its own unique challenges, and we overcame them together and we will need your help to continue to overcome them.

Let us continue to build on this momentum and strive for continued improvement in the future.

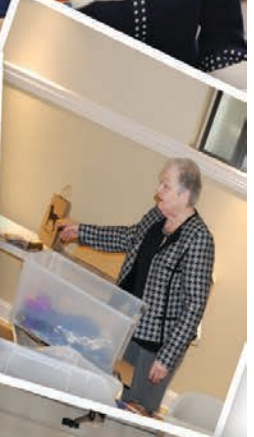
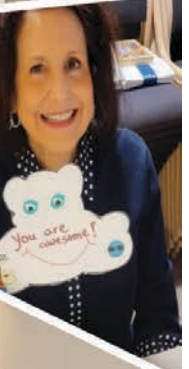
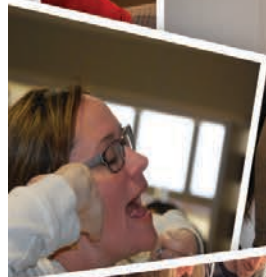


# HANUKKAH FESTIVITIES

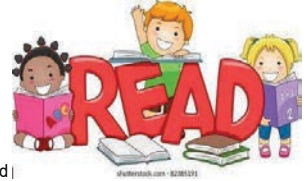

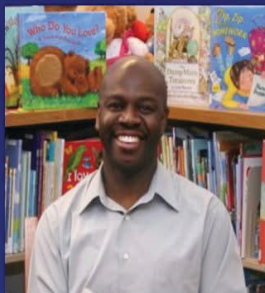
