MESSAGE FROM RABBI MARC

As we approach Passover, we must remember that we are not celebrating something that happened. We are celebrating something that happens. Historical or not, the Exodus and journey to freedom are ongoing perennial experiences. We celebrate the holiday as a reminder of what was, what is, and what must be.

The Mishnah informs us, “In each and every generation, a person stands obligated to see themselves as if they left Egypt.” The story from struggle to freedom is our story. Throughout our lives, we faced challenges we had to overcome. Sometimes, these challenges were overwhelming. We have lost loved ones, faced obstacles in school and at work, battled illnesses and injuries, and come face to face with the moments that we felt sure that we could not endure. Slavery in Egypt is our story.



At the same time, we have experienced opportunities for blessings that came from nowhere, dug deeper spiritually and found our way through, been held and supported by people we love, and at the very least, if you are reading this, you lived to face the next day. Rabbi Abraham Joshua Heschel taught us, “Just to be is a blessing. Just to live is holy.” Too often, we focus so much on the pain that we ignore the blessings surrounding us. A professor once asked me how the sting from sticking my finger on a thorn bush was good. He answered, “If you haven’t had any feeling in the finger in years, the fact you can feel is, itself, a blessing.”

We cannot always decide what will happen to us. We can always decide what to do with it. We cannot always control who comes into our lives. We control how we welcome or dismiss them. We cannot know what God does or is. We assuredly can know that what we do matters.

As you prepare to sit for Seder this year, look up ways to add a conversation about justice and healing to the conversation. Truly, then, you will be like our Biblical ancestors, helping each other from oppression into freedom. Ultimately, Passover’s mission will not end until the world knows freedom. We are not there yet, but Pirke Avot teaches us that we are not obligated to finish the task of peace, but we are not allowed not to work for it. Good Yuntiff.

FACILITIES COMMITTEE REPORT

The committee has recently been tasked with generating a Facilities Condition Assessment (FCA). An FCA is a comprehensive evaluation of the condition of a facility's various components. The assessment will be conducted by Steve Davidheiser, P.E. and Tim Carre, P.E.

Tim is a licensed Professional Engineer and has over 30 years of construction experience that includes 18 years in the field of structural engineering. Steve is a licensed Professional Engineer with over 20 years of construction experience which includes preparing detailed budgeting cost estimates for a wide variety of project types. Together they will go room by room evaluating the structural elements, mechanical systems, electrical systems, etc. In addition to the visual inspections, this effort will also include data collection, analysis, and the strategic planning necessary to keep facilities in optimal working condition.

The final product will be a comprehensive snapshot of the facility's health with the goal of helping our congregation understand what is working well and what needs attention. The assessment will also assist the facilities committee with developing the facilities budget and planning for long-term and short-term facility upgrades and maintenance items to ensure that our home remains functional and vibrant.

Recommendations will include cost-savings measures to improve operating efficiency long-term, optimizing usage of the existing spaces, and immediate needs for repair or replacement of failing or aging systems that have exceeded their useful service life if identified.

Currently the annual operating cost of Temple Ohev Sholom is estimated at \$150,000/year just to keep the lights on and complete minor repairs as needed.

During the warmer months, she enjoys walking to Conodoguinet Creek to collect rocks and photograph wildlife. She also loves sketching, reading, and playing video games. In addition to Hebrew, Evelyn has spent the past year as a first-year Spanish student and is passionate about writing.

Evelyn is known for her kindness, loyalty to her friends, deep insight, witty personality, and wisdom beyond her years.

In Jewish tradition, worn or damaged religious texts that contain God's name are buried in a designated area of a cemetery called a "genizah" (Hebrew for "hiding place") as a sign of respect. Temple Ohev has a genizah, and Evelyn will collect worn texts from the synagogue for internment as part of her service project.

Evelyn's Torah portion, Shemini (Leviticus 9:1–11:47), begins on the eighth day in the Tabernacle and details the inauguration of the priesthood and the beginning of the Israelites' worship, including the first sacrifices, the divine fire consuming the offerings, and the establishment of the Kosher laws regarding clean and unclean animals and ritual purity.

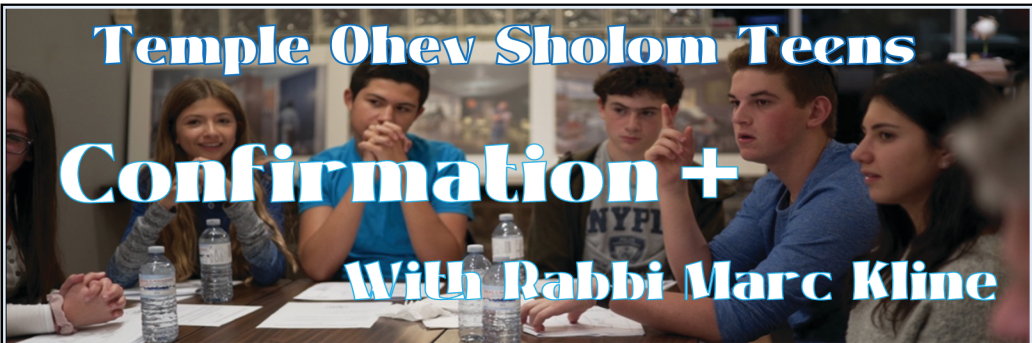

In an effort to pass the torch of remembrance to the next generation, students from congregational Religious Schools will take part in the opening ceremony and will also read names. 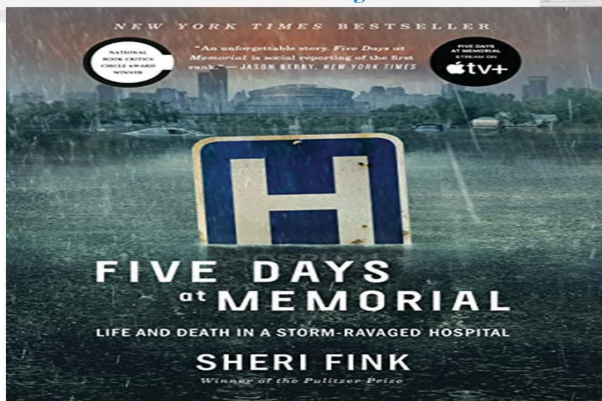

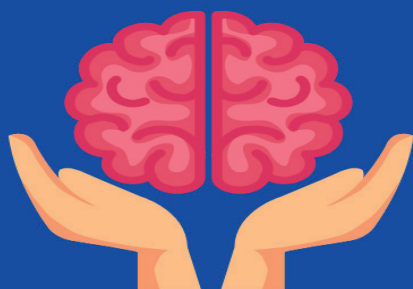
