FINAL FAREWELL FROM RABBI MARC

As I sit to write this article, I have deeply mixed emotions. I am excited for the next chapter in life to begin.

I am grateful for the blessings that 35 years of Rabbinic service have brought to my life. The people, the service opportunities, the people, the lifetime of experiences, the people, and the people - I could not have asked for a more fulfilling, more rewarding career, a more mind and heartexpanding career path. In each place I have served, I have met (and gathered) people who touch and change my life, people I hold close even in distant geographies. THANK YOU FOR BEING SOME OF THE PEOPLE ON THIS LIST! Thank you for



the incredible blessings you have shared with Lori and me over the last three years.

I am reflective. Over 35 years of service, I have seen and experienced almost any blessing or challenge a Rabbi could face. As a sitting rabbi, I have led and grown congregations through lawsuits, healing from previously abusive clergy, and abusive community outrage. I have held families through their healing from loss, sometimes horrific loss. I have held the newest of babies, helped bring couples together (and back together), stood with hundreds of young adults through our ritual coming-of-age ceremonies, helped bring people into our faith world, and stood on the front lines - sometimes even the "lightning-rod" for justice and peace-building worldwide.

I will never get the "gold watch" or be the long-term beloved "Emeritus" Rabbi. The call I accepted was to serve. The teachers who have blessed me throughout my life keep reminding me that my work is to pay forward the blessings people have passed to me. I have a strong resume, and I can tell you who pushed, shoved, led, pulled, or talked me into serving for each accomplishment and honor. I pray that I have helped teach people with the love with which people taught me.

The most profound lesson I ever learned came from my Rabbi on the eve before I left for Jerusalem to begin rabbinical school. I had just closed a successful law practice and felt myself jumping into the abyss on a leap of faith. Rabbi Gene Levy wanted to share his deepest, heartfelt advice, and I was eager to learn. "If you don't ask yourself, every day, 'What the hell am I doing here?' you don't belong." I was so disappointed - I was waiting for something profound. It did not take long to realize that those words were lifeaffirming and honest beyond question. Every day, we must want to be present to serve and change the world. When the day comes that we no longer feel called to serve, it is time to switch gears. After 35 years, I am ready to serve differently now. I will leave you with four thoughts:

1. Rabbi Levy was not only spot on for clergy; his advice speaks to everyone's everyday experience. Faith begins with the intention of showing up. Whatever our job, task, stewardship, or focus. We must show up with a heart bent on serving and dignifying life around us.

2. If we tiptoe through life quietly, we will allow everyone else to govern our lives. We must stand up for our needs and neighbors' needs - at the same time. Justice and healing is never about one or the other of us - "Justice is never just us." "Shalom" means everyone is whole; as people of faith, that is our mandate. We must not wait for someone else to do the work - it is ours to accomplish.

3. Please stay in touch. The blessings of our time, heart, energy, and commitment should not end simply because we are apart.

4. Love your new Rabbi. Love her enough to remember that she is new and that you need to grow with her. Temple Ohev Sholom stands on the precipice of a significant shift in its trajectory. Dive in and own your place in this family. You have good people serving in leadership, but Torah teaches us that we are all a "Mamlekhet Kohanim - a kingdom of priests." Every member of our Temple family has a role to play. Don't let someone else take your place at the table. Grow the table so that you both have space to serve.




