MESSAGE FROM RABBI JASPER

Shanah Tovah,

It's hard to believe Rosh Hashanah has already come and gone. Together, with the help and presence of so many of you, we ushered in 5786 with intention and joy. And now, as the echoes of the shofar still ring in our ears, we find ourselves on the threshold of the next sacred moments in our calendar: Yom Kippur, Sukkot, and Simchat Torah.

At first glance, these holidays may seem unrelated. Yom Kippur is solemn and introspective, a day of atonement and return. Sukkot is joyful and earthy, celebrating the harvest and the impermanence of life.



Simchat Torah bursts with celebration as we dance with our scrolls, closing one cycle of Torah and immediately beginning another.

But beneath their differences lies a shared spiritual thread. Each of them invites us to begin again.

On Yom Kippur, we return to our truest selves. We ask forgiveness, seek healing, and commit to change. As the gates begin to close at *Ne'ilah*, we are offered a rare and sacred gift: a clean slate. In the words of the prophet Isaiah, *"Though your sins be like scarlet, they shall be as white as snow"* (Isaiah 1:18). The power of Yom Kippur lies not only in confession, but in transformation. It is the ultimate spiritual reset.

Sukkot, which follows just days later, grounds that spiritual work in the physical world. We move from the sanctuary to the sukkah. We shake the lulav and etrog, symbols of unity and diversity, and invite guests to dwell with us. The Talmud teaches that hachnasat orchim, welcoming guests, is even greater than greeting the Divine Presence (Shabbat 127a). On Sukkot, we bring our renewed selves into a fragile space open to the sky. We embrace impermanence while laying the foundations for lasting relationships and the sacred act of hospitality.

And then comes Simchat Torah, we watch our youngest ones begin their Jewish education with Consecration. This is at the same time that we close the final verses of Deuteronomy and immediately open to the first words of Genesis: "In the beginning..." or Bereshit. As Rabbi Ben Bag-Bag said of Torah, "Turn it and

turn it again, for everything is in it" (Pirkei Avot 5:22). Simchat Torah reminds us that the story never ends. Each ending is also a beginning. Each year, we step once more into the sacred story and bring all our experience, our growth, and our questions with us. In this month of October, we live fully in what I like to call the season of starting

over. The High Holy Days gave us the intention. These next festivals give us the tools to act and to try again.

No one knows what this year will bring. But our tradition promises us that beginning again is always possible. Whether in prayer, in relationship, or in selfgrowth, Judaism teaches that we are never stuck. We can always return. Teshuvah is

not just something we do once a year. It is a daily practice. May the rhythm of these sacred days remind us that we are co-creators with God in shaping our lives. May we build the habits, connections, and compassion that help

us become who we are meant to be.

Shanah Tovah and G'mar Chatimah Tovah. May we start over, inscribed in the Book of Life.
