MESSAGE FROM RABBI JASPER

As we enter December, we watch as our days get darker. No longer are we blessed with a beautiful sunset as we enter the sanctuary for Shabbat. Now, the darkness and shadows guide our steps. It's easy to feel the weight of this time of year. But our Jewish response to darkness has always been the same: we are the source of light.

In the Talmudic tractate, Shabbat 21b, it reads,

Beit Shammai says: On the **first day one kindles eight** lights and, from **there on, gradually decreases** the number of lights until, on the last day of Hanukkah, they kindle one light.

And Beit Hillel says: On the **first day one kindles one light**, and from **there on, gradually increases** the number of lights until, on the last day, they kindle eight lights.

This passage, like many in the Talmud, is a disagreement between two schools of thought about the proper way one is to light the Hanukkiah, aka the Menorah. For the House of Shammai, they believe that you begin with all eight candles, and on the last night you end with just one.

We traditionally do not follow this school of thought, preferring the House of Hillel who tells us the opposite - begin with one candle and gradually increase each night until there are all eight. But why do we do this?

For Hillel and his followers, he understood that the Hanukkah candles should grow in light, as the holiness of this time grows too. This is the argument we use whenever we are thinking about our holidays and gatherings. Our responsibility to one another is to increase the light in the world, rather than decrease it.

The great Talmudic scholar, Sefat Emet, further teaches that the Hanukkah light represents the hidden divine spark within each soul. When we act with kindness, faith, or courage, we let that spark shine. And when we bring our lights together, we create something powerful, a ner tamid, an everlasting burning light, that pushes back even the longest nights.



I saw that light shining so clearly during my installation weekend. Thank you to everyone who came out to celebrate, to pray, to sing, and to welcome me and my family into this sacred community. I know that Temple Ohev Sholom is a place where the light burns brightly. You reminded me that I am not stepping into the unknown, but into a bright future.

Just as one candle lights another without losing any of its own glow, so too may we bring our light to one another in the weeks ahead. May we continue to build a community where each of us becomes our source of light. Afterall, everyone
"Belongs @ Ohev."
