Now more than ever, we must continue to show up for one another and remain engaged in Jewish life.

At Temple Ohev Sholom, connection is our strength. Each act of participation, whether through worship, learning, or service, affirms that fear will not define us.

As we move forward, let us do so with intention and compassion, rooted in our shared values. The future of Jewish life is shaped not only by what happens around us, but by how we respond together.

May we find strength in community and hope in the knowledge that we do not walk this path alone.

# MESSAGE FROM RABBI JASPER

## **Olam chesed yibaneh. We must build our world from love.**

These words from Psalm 89:3 have been circling my heart and mind this season. Since learning of the horrific antisemitic attack at Bondi Beach in Australia on December 16, I have been wrestling with what it truly means to build a world from love when hatred so often feels louder and more visible.

It seems that each time we turn on the news, we are confronted with another act of gun violence. Bondi Beach. Brown University. The list continues to grow.

We witness targeted attacks and deep pain. And so the question rises, sometimes as a prayer and sometimes as a cry: where is love? When will we stop turning on one another and begin turning towards one another in peace.

When the Psalmist teaches that the world is built on love, they quietly acknowledge that the work is unfinished. The world is not yet whole. Creation, our tradition suggests, is still unfolding. We are not merely inhabitants of the world but partners in its becoming. Pirkei Avot reminds us, "It is not upon you to finish the work, but neither are you free to desist from it." Each day, we are called to choose love, even when doing so feels vulnerable or insufficient. We are asked to see the darkness clearly and to respond with kindness anyway.

A world built on love requires intention and effort. It requires structure and commitment. It asks each of us to show up daily and place more compassion into the world than cruelty. Sometimes that looks small. A smile offered to a stranger. A moment of patience. An act of generosity for someone who is unhoused, choosing care instead of judgment. Sometimes it looks like refusing to spread hateful speech and choosing learning over anger. As Rabbi Schneur Zalman of Liadi taught, a little light pushes away much darkness. We are not asked to eliminate the darkness, only to increase the light.

The attack at Bondi Beach was terrifying. It sent shockwaves through



the Jewish community and stirred a familiar fear that it could happen anywhere, even here. And yet, alongside that fear, there was also compassion. Neighbors, partners, and interfaith friends reached out. Messages of care and solidarity arrived. In the midst of pain, we were reminded that we do not stand alone.

Our tradition teaches, "Do not separate yourself from the community." In moments of fear, gathering itself becomes an act of courage. Choosing connection becomes an act of resistance. From the darkness, light emerged.

As we enter this new year, may we commit ourselves again to that light. May we notice it, nurture it, and allow it to shine even in difficult moments.

May this year be one where love finally wins.




